2016 Construction Season Portland Project

There is a large capital project in the Portland district. It is a project to replace the existing 6" line from our ANR/Transcanada purchase point to the town of Portland.

We will change the operating pressure from 395 psig in the existing line to 500 psig in the new line. This will increase the amount of gas available to the Portland District to satisfy future needs.

Miller Pipeline was awarded the construction contract for this project.

Melvin Lewis, Winchester District, is the Chief Inspector for the project. **Jeff Snyder** is the onsite inspector and representative for the Portland District. **Scott Pine** is an inspector from USDI working under contract for OVG. Design work was a collaboration between the OVG Engineering team and USDI, from Olney, IL.

The Engineering Team is using this project as the first step in our Smart Mapping Initiative. The location and physical characteristics of all facilities are being recorded with GPS units. This information will then be laid over an aerial image to create a real-world map. We will also have the ability to view the maps electronically and click on any item to see its characteristics-such as size, wall thickness, MAOP, Work Order, the location of welds, the welder who made the welds, etc. The possibilities are almost unlimited. Lisa Watson and Damon Breen have been working very hard on this project. Zach Bower has joined our team and is getting familiarized with the units and collecting data. This is an exciting initiative that will revolutionize our record keeping and mapping capabilities.







SUPERINTENDENTS' MEETING

The meeting was being led by Damon Breen and Greg Bailey on the new Trimble GPS units on how the superintendents wanted to design the program to capture the information required for the Smartmapping Project OVG is creating.

Smartmapping is a data collection project that will revolutionize OVG's mapping system. We will be collecting geospatial data (GPS locations) for all the items in our system. We will be assigning attributes, or characteristics, such as size, pressure, physical characteristics to each main, fitting, etc.

The finished product will allow us to view each District's system in its entirety, along with all of the collected information. For instance, when we collect information about a main and put it on the map, we will be able to click on that main and see operating pressure, year of installation, material grade (if known), test pressures, etc. All of the system maps will be laid over aerial images for a "birds eye" view of each system.
